Unit Seven

Present Perfect (I have done)

l/ we / they/ you	Have (='ve)	past participle
He / she / it	Has (='s)	past participle

The past participle often ends in –ed (finished/ decided), but many important verbs are irregular (lost/ done/ been written...etc.)

The action of the present perfect is in the past but has a result now:

- 1- 'Where's your key?' 'I've lost it.' (I haven't got it now)
- 2- 'Is Sally here?' 'No, she's gone out.' (she is out now)

We often use the present perfect to give new information or to announce a recent happening:

The road is closed. There's been (= there has been) an accident.

You can use the present perfect with just, already and yet:

Just= a short time ago: Hello. Have you just arrived?

Already= to say that something happened sooner than expected:

'What time is Mark leaving'? 'He's already gone.

Yet= 'until now' and shows that the speaker is expecting something to happen. Use yet only in questions and negative sentences:

Has it stopped raining yet?

Note the difference between gone (to) and been (to):

- 1- Jim has gone to Spain. (= he is there now or on his way there)
- 2- Jane has been to Italy. (= she has now come back from Italy)

Exercise: Read the situations and write sentences with just, already or yet:

- 1- Joe goes out. Five minutes later, the phone rings and the caller says ' Can I speak to Joe?' You say: I'm afraid......(go out)
- 2- You are eating in a restaurant. The waiter thinks you have finished and starts to take your plate away. You say: Wait a minute!.....(not finish)
- 3- You are going to a restaurant this evening. You phone to reserve a table. Later your friend says 'Shall I phone to reserve a table?' you say: No,it.(do)
